In Maths, we explored 2D shapes through lots of hands-on investigation, and in Geography we took a trip around the world to discover delicious foods found in cafés everywhere.


Excitement is building as we get ready for our Christmas Show, "It's a Baby!". The children have been singing, acting, and practising their lines with huge enthusiasm.

We also explored the Austrian artist Gustav Klimt and created our own 'Tree of light'. In Gaeilge, we have been focusing on developing our reading skills. The classes have thoroughly enjoyed diving into the fiction books An Pláinéad Zog and An Cás. Their knowledge of Irish verbs and their confidence in forming sentences as Gaeilge are growing steadily. In English, our grammar work this month centred on homophones. We had great fun identifying, exploring, and understanding the many homophones that appear
