April was a short but jam packed month in junior and senior infants. We started a new learning theme of the Emergency Services. We have giant cardboard houses in the classroom and the children have been very busy rescuing each other from the burning buildings. There are very brave firefighters in

Shountrade this month! The children have also learned about many other emergency service providers including paramedics and the gardaí. In History the children learned about the history of firefighting and compared and contrasted the uniform, tools and fire engines used long ago with those available now.

We started literacy liftoff this month. Every day the children rotate around five learning stations – familiar and new reading, phonics, handwriting, oral

language (fairy tales) and online literacy games. The children have been working very hard at each of the stations and as a result their cursive handwriting is developing beautifully, as well as their fluency in reading. Many thanks to Mr Kilcoyne, Ms Walsh and Geraldine for making the literacy hour a very enjoyable start to the day.

One of the highlights of the month was taking advantage of the good weather and taking our learning outside. The children enjoyed getting outside for maths lessons, PE and playtime.
