Junior & Senior Infants

February has been a busy month in junior and senior infants. This month we introduced an exciting new learning theme by setting up a vet's play area in the classroom. The children worked together to create the 'Vet's Surgery', taking on roles as vets, nurses, and pet owners. They cared for stuffed animals, wrote appointment cards, and issued prescriptions. Through this imaginative play, they learned about animal care, the importance of kindness towards pets, and how vets help keep animals healthy.

For Valentine's Day, the junior and senior infants created stunning oil pastel heart artworks, drawing inspiration from the renowned Brazilian artist Romero Britto. Their vibrant and colourful designs reflected Britto's signature style, combining bold patterns and bright hues. The activity allowed the children to express their creativity while celebrating the spirit of love and friendship.

Finally, both junior and senior infants have made fantastic progress during their hurling lessons with Conor this month. They have been developing essential movement skills while improving their catching and striking techniques. Their enthusiasm and determination have been evident, making each session a fun and rewarding experience.











1st Class

February has been a fun month in first class with lots of learning. In maths we have been learning how to subtract and how to read the time. We all enjoyed doing lots of Valentine's art. The children learned about the artist Wassily Kandinsky. We learned about his abstract style of art and his use of colour. We created love heart paintings in the style of Kandinsky. The children have been doing great work on ukelele and recorder. Keep up the recorder practise at home! We are exploring the narrative writing genre. We have learned that a narrative is in past tense and always has a problem and resolution. We look forward to writing some of our own narratives. 2nd Class

February was a month full of fun, learning, and creativity in Second Class! In literacy, we dived into the theme of Spring feasts, discovering the fascinating traditions behind St. Valentine, St. Patrick, and St. Brigid. As part of our learning, the children honed their report-writing skills, crafting thoughtful and creative pieces that showcased both their knowledge and imagination. Art was a highlight this month as the children worked with clay, learning new techniques and creating fantastic pieces.

Maths lessons were filled with excitement as we explored the concept of length through interactive games and activities. Measuring and comparing different objects helped bring learning to life in a fun and practical way. In science, we investigated floating and sinking, designing and building our own boats before testing how much weight they could carry. The children loved predicting, experimenting, and discovering how different materials and shapes affect buoyancy. A special part of this month was preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The children have been working hard in their preparations, and we were delighted to receive a lovely visit from Monsignor Neenan, who spoke with the class and offered words of encouragement. It has been a busy and exciting month, and we look forward to all the learning and adventures ahead!





3rd Class

February has been a fantastic month in Third Class. We've been busy exploring a variety of topics and we are excited to share what we've been up to. In Maths, we concluded our unit on Chance, where we learned all about probability and how likely or unlikely events can be. Now, we're diving into the topic of Time, and the students are having a blast learning to read analogue clocks and understand time intervals. It's been a rewarding challenge, and we're loving it! In English, the class completed their very own report books. Each pupil wrote a detailed report on a topic they are passionate about, everything from animals to space and sports. Everyone did an excellent job researching and presenting their findings! Gymnastics was another highlight, and we're proud to say the class has mastered some fantastic skills! The students worked in groups to design and build four unique bridge models. We can't wait to compare them and see which design holds the most weight! 4th Class

Fourth Class had an amazing time exploring the fascinating world of the Vikings this February!
