## Dear Parent/ Guardian,

As you are aware, we have now received directive from the Taoiseach and the Department of Education and Skills to remain closed until Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> of April, which will coincide with the end of our Easter Break.

We have not been in this situation before, so it is new to all of us. As you know primary teaching works best when carried out face to face but we will endeavor to support you in facilitating learning at home in the coming weeks. I want to reassure you that when we do return to school your child's learning needs will be fully supported by a team of very dedicated professionals.

#### **Primary Language Curriculum**

We were due to have a half day closure next Friday the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April for teacher in-service Primary Language Curriculum. Our teachers in Shountrade NS will be engaging with the training Webinar from home due to our current guidelines.

### Re: Work for next week

We will not be asking the children to cover any curricular work for the 2 weeks of Easter. The following is a body of work that our teachers have prepared for their pupils in each class for next week.

### **Junior Infants**

#### Dear Parents,

Below is a list of <u>suggested</u> homework that the children may complete in the coming week. It includes revision of work that the children have already learned in school. Children in junior infants learn best through play which is why so much of the infant day at school is made up of playful hands-on activities and less book work. I have taken this approach to the suggested homework this week in the hope of making it enjoyable and fun for all.

### Day 1:

Phonics – Revise letter sounds in sounds book up to and including 'sh'.

With Group 5 letter sounds (z, w, ng, v, short oo and long oo) write out each sound twice and play a memory matching game, practising the letter sounds as you play. (Previous group 1-4 letter sounds can also be incorporated).

*Word box* – Revise words in word box. Pick an occasional word as the child is reading and challenge them to put it in a sentence for you e.g. 'duck' – I saw a duck in the pond.

*Tricky Words* – practice the tricky words (on yellow card in word box). Write out the newer tricky words (I, the, he, she, me) on paper and play 'Password Detective' by taping one word at various doors around the house. This is the password to enter/leave the room. Child must point to the word every time they enter the room.

*Shared Reading* – Continue to read the orange reader in your child's folder. This can be read to and then repeated by your child or if they are confident they can read it aloud themselves, either a few pages a day or the whole book each day.

### Maths – Revision of Story of 5

Draw several sets of five objects and have your child draw a line partitioning the sets in as many different ways they can, writing the correct numeral next to each (1 and 4, 2 and 3, 3 and 2, 4 and 1, 5 and 0). A more hands-on and fun way to do the activity is to have your child use 5 teddies, toy cars, dolls etc. and partition/divide the dolls in as many different ways they can making a number story to go with each (e.g. there were two red cars and three yellow cars in the car park).

#### Day 2:

Phonics – Revise all letter sounds in sounds book up to and including 'sh'.

With Group 5 letter sounds (z, w, ng, v, short oo and long oo) write out each sound twice and play a memory matching game, practising the letter sounds as you play. (Previous group 1-4 letter sounds can also be incorporated).

*Word box* – Revise all words in word box. Pick an occasional word as the child is reading and challenge them to put it in a sentence for you e.g. 'duck' – I saw a duck in the pond.

*Tricky Words* – practice the tricky words (on yellow card in wordbox). Write out the newer tricky words (I, the, he, she, me) on paper, cut them up and have your child put them back together like a jigsaw puzzle.

*Shared Reading* – Continue to read the orange reader in your child's folder. This can be read to and then repeated by your child or if they are confident they can read it aloud themselves, either a few pages a day or the whole book each day.

## Maths – The Story of 5

Using five mini toys / grapes / peas etc. play a game of 'Hide and Seek'. Show your child the set of five items. Ask them to turn away while you hide some under a cup/bowl. They must work out how many you took away. Take turns.
