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#### **Parents Information Night**

Shountrade National School for the first time had a Parents Information Night for current parents of the school. Presentations from teachers on certain aspects of school life were delivered. Mrs. Lyons spoke about Child Safe Guarding Measures. Mrs. Lyons is Designated Liaison Person and Mr O'Connell is Deputy Designated Liaison **Person**. Mr O'Connell spoke about Sport and the very busy schedule of sport in Shountrade National School outlining Hurling, Football, Camogie, Indoor Hurling/Camogie, Spikeball and other sporting activities. Ms Walsh presented on 3<sup>rd</sup> class homework and transition from the junior section of primary school to the senior section and that pupils now must take some responsibility for their own learning. Ms Ryan spoke about Literacy Lift-Off and the benefits of this initiative on children's reading and comprehension and showed delightful, live sound bites and video clips of pupils expressing their views! Mrs. Fitzgerald spoke about a new initiative that we intend to implement in the near future – *Guided Reading*. This will act as a continuation from *Literacy Lift-Off* and as a preparation for Non-Fiction texts that will be encountered as our pupils continue their education right through Secondary School. Ms Dore outlined what Junior & Senior Infants are doing at the moment and of what should be expected at this stage regarding homework and developing pupils' independence. She assured parents that all students had settled well and all is going according to plan. Ms Cantillon made a bilingual presentation on Bliain na Gaeilge and encouraged parents to have a positive attitude towards our native language as well as using it positively at home. Mrs Ryan presented on 1st & 2nd class and spoke about First Holy Communion and informed parents about her intrinsic reward system an approach in the classroom where pupils value their own work and are proud of their efforts!

It was Mrs. Ryan's first time meeting our parents and we are very delighted to have her as part of our team.
